APPROVING THE SOUTH DAKOTA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION PROPOSED FUNCTIONAL CLASSIFICATION

WHEREAS, there are identified specific types of roads and corresponding functions

of those roads, some of which have not been updated for several years; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), has prescribed rules governing the functional classification of roadways within Day County; and

WHEREAS, the South Dakota Department of Transportation (SDDOT) has verified all roadway mileage for Day County; and

WHEREAS, SDDOT has recommended that changes be made to specific roadways based upon functional classification standards as prescribed by FHWA.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of County Commissioners hereby approve changing the following functional classifications in Day County:

Rural Major Collector to a Rural Minor Collector

126th St: From 435th Ave. east approximately 1.574 to 437th Ave.

437th Ave: From 126th St. northeasterly approximately 1.363 miles to 125th St.

125th St: From 437th Ave. east approximately 1.620 miles to SD 25.

PIERPONT TOWN PROPERTY: Upon recommendation from States Attorney, moved by Tobin seconded by James to accept the deed in lieu of taxes on parcel #75.06.1209 in Pierpont Town. Motion carried.

COVID-19 COURTHOUSE GUIDELINES: Discussion on when the courthouse will be open to the public. The commissioners decided to keep the courthouse closed with limited access until their June 16th commissioner meeting when they will review situation again.

DRIVERS LICENSE BY APPOINTMENT: The auditor was contacted by Matt Medford, Driver Licensing Area Supervisor, to see if the commissioners would allow the driver's license office in the courthouse to be open for appointments only. The commissioners decided to allow the driver's license office to be open for appointment only and follow the courthouse guidelines.

DECLARE SURPLUS: Moved by Walters, seconded by Sinner to declare the following items surplus and no longer useful for county purposes: two old non-working floor buffers, snow blower and a Lawn Boy push mower. Items that do not work can be disposed of and remaining items will be sold at a later date. Motion carried.

MITIGATION FUNDING: OEM Anderson discussed with the board two new requests for the 2019 Mitigation Funding.

PRE-DISASTER MITIGATION PLAN: Alison Kiez, Loan Fund Manager with NECOG, set up a ZOOM meeting to discuss the Pre-Disaster Mitigation Plan. The Day County Mitigation Plan activities for flooding hazards was discussed. The Mitigation Plan is posted on the county website for review.

RECYCLING TRAILER: Jennifer Moos contacted the auditor asking the commissioners to contribute to the Recycling Trailer Fund which is still short \$525.00. Moved by Sinner, seconded by Walters to donate \$525.00 to the Recycling Trailer Fund. Motion carried.
